Under and by virtue of an Act entitled, "An Act to amend Section 206 of Chapter 342 Private Laws of North Carolina, Session 1907," ratified by the General Assembly of North Carolina the 11th day of October 1913, an election will be neld in the City of Charlotte on the 10th da- of March 914, under the same rules and reguations that govern the election of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of said City as now prescribed by law. A new registration has been ordered the Board of Aldermen of the City Charlotte in accordance with the provisions of said Act. The registration books before said election will be kept open for a period of thirty days (including Sundays) preceding the 10th day of March, 1914, after which date no one shall be allowed to register for said election,

The purpose of the election is the submission to the qualified voters of the City of Charlotte the said Act entitled, "An Act to Amend Section 206, Chapter 342, Private Laws of North Caronna, Session 1907," so that there may be levied an annual tax for the support and maintenance of the sessions of the public schools in the City of Charlotte which special tax shall be not exceeding 50c (instead of 20c) on the hundred dollars valuation of property and 90c (instead of 60c) on the poli
