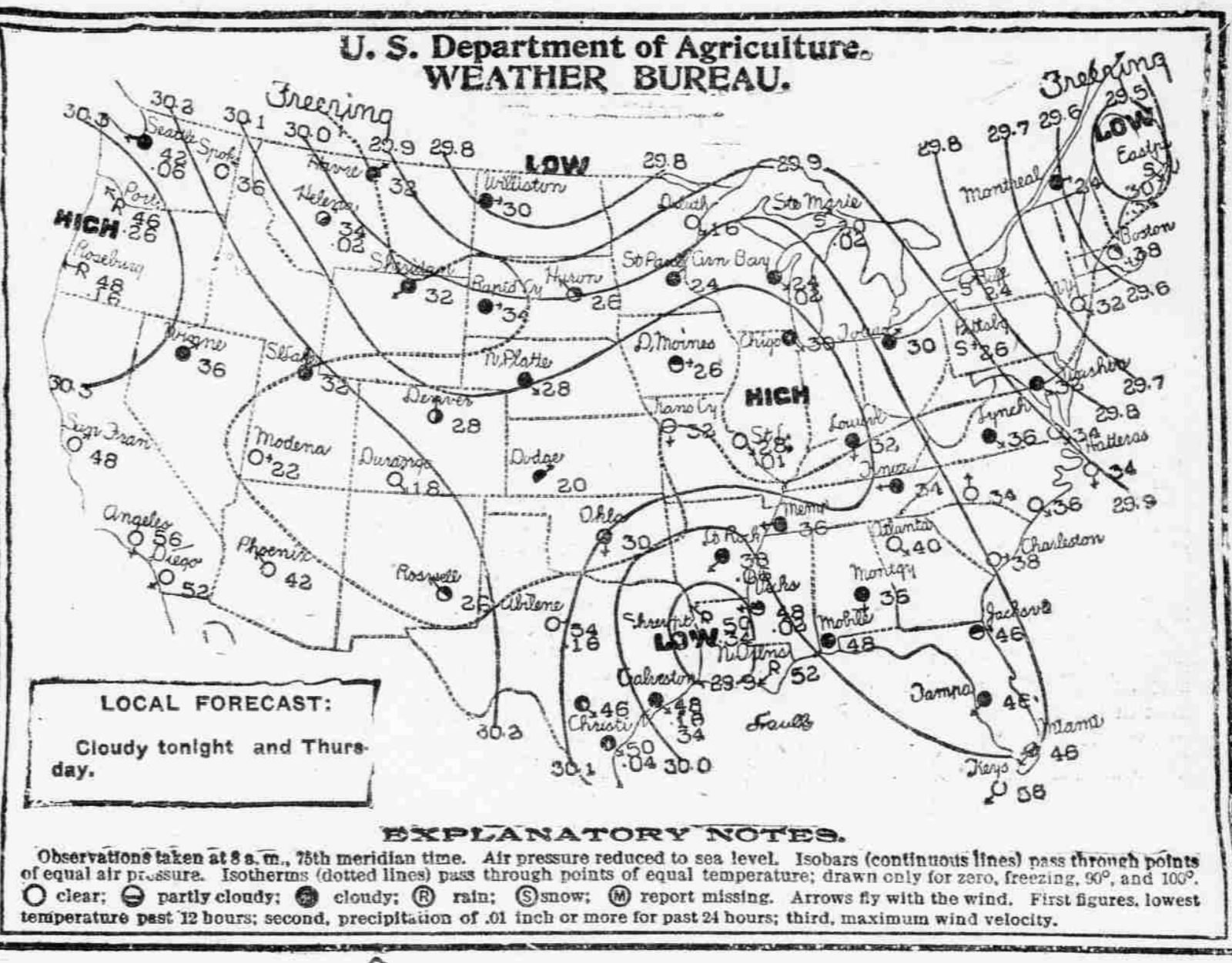
CORNER STONE OF MASONIC

BIG TIMBER TRACT IN DISPUTE

Washington, March 4.—Consideration of the Hebard-Hebard litigation over title to 49,000 acres of timber land along the North Carolina-Tennessee border, was postponed today by the Supreme Court. Attorneys general of the two states informed the court the determination of the location of the state boundary line, the point involved in an original suit brought by North Carolina against Tennessee. They objected to reaching of a decision before representatives of the two states were heard.

BECKER WITNESS FEARS FOR HIS LIFE

New York, March 4.—Louis Krese, a waiter who testified for the prosecution at the trial of former Police Lieutenant Charles Becker for the murder of Herman Rosenthal, called at the district attorney's office today and asked for protection. He said he had been offered money to get out of town before Becker's second trial was started and that he had refused. Of late he had been hiding, he said, for fear of his life. "I'm afraid to walk the streets," said the waiter. "I want to be protected so I can go to work." He was assured that a bodyguard would be furnished.

APPROPRIATION BILL IS REPORTED

By Associated Press. Columbia, S. C., March 4.—The general appropriation bill for 1914, reported by conferees of the house and senate today, carries a total of \$2,213,657,544 and provides for a tax levy of six mills. Yesterday there was a difference between the conferees of \$214,000 but an agreement was reached and senate amendments during the appropriations prevailed in the main. Among the items placed back in the bill was \$10,000 for a tuberculosis hospital.
