





Attention should therefore again be called o the fact, says the Journal of the American Medical Associttion,

tha tthe names "sodium phosphate" and "sodium phosphite" are so similar that a serious error can be made by the misprinting of misinterpretation of a single letter. Sodium phospite has been suggested as an antidote to mercuric chlorid because it acts as a reducing agent to convert mercuric acid into calomel-mercurous chloridwhile the phosphite is changed to phosphate. Sodium phosphate will have soon rush the growler, (referring to no such action on mercuric chlorid be-


