Court

Decision

In an opinion dated November 25, 1974, the University Court recommended to Chancellor Colvard that disciplinary sanctions be imposed against three students found to have been involved in a shooting incident in Dorm '72 on October 31.

The Court, composed of four faculty members and a student, recommended suspension from the University for two semesters for the student who owned the .22 pistol and who in fact shot another student. The Chancellor upheld the Court's opinion. One of the other two students involved was suspended from the residence halls for two semesters, beginning with the spring semester 1975, and was also put on disciplinary probation for one semester. The third student was sentenced to disciplinary probation until the end of the spring semester 1975.

The Court's opinion quoted the North Carolina General Statute 14-269, which states in effect that it is unlawful for any person to possess any type of firearm or weapon on a University campus unless approved for ceremonial use by the administration.

This action was brought on behalf of the student body by the Attorney General.

they are being obviously shortchanged.

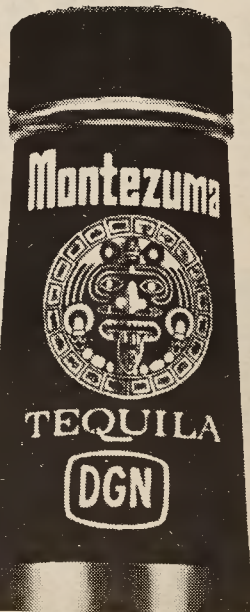
