

Atkins Library provides corrections

The Atkins Library would like to provide a correction to information which appeared in the article "Alternative Lifestyles on the UNCC Campus," in the April 15 Carolina Journal. All of the titles which were recommended by the student to supplement the library's collection of books on homosexuality are on order. The student had spoken with Susan Melson, head of the acquisitions department, who told him that the list would be reviewed, not that the materials would definitely be in the library by February. Because of special catch-funds added to the library budget this year, the book ordering process has been considerably slowed down.

The library already has one

of the titles requested by the student: Martin Hoffman, *The Gay World*, 1968 (HQ 76 H635). Other titles we would recommend are: Laud Humphrey, *Out of the Closets, the Sociology of Homosexual Liberation*, 1972 (which includes the final report of the Task Force on Homosexuality of the National Institute of Mental Health) (HQ 76.8 U5 M33); Edwin Schur, *Crimes Without Victims; Deviant Behavior and Public Policy* (HV 6493 S3); and the Great Britain Committee on Homosexual Offences and Prostitution, *The Wolfenden Report*, 1963 (HQ 76 G7 1963).
