

Government imposes spending limits

As you may already know, Governor Jim Holshouser has imposed certain spending limitations which became effective February 26, 1976. The General Administration

issued additional information on the subject in the form of "Spending Limitation Guidelines" which was disseminated on March 2.

A series of UNCC guidelines

and implementing procedures will be issued within the next few days. In addition to the specific limitations, a significant reduction in our fourth-quarter allotment has been imposed and

will affect every element of this campus for the remainder of the present fiscal year.

The first of the implementing instructions pertains to the travel expenditure for the balance of the fiscal year. No in-state travel expenditures will be made unless it is determined by department heads that such travel is essential for a department or agency to perform its function. There will be no out-of-state travel expenditures incurred by nonelected officers or employees without the prior written authorization of the Division of State Budget.

The words "department head" as used in the preceding statement are interpreted to mean the Chancellor of UNCC. To simplify and expedite obtaining approval for in-state travel, the Vice Chancellors will review and approve travel

deemed essential for the functions and activities of areas reporting to them. Requests for out-of-state travel, with justification, will be forwarded not less than 14 days prior to the requested date for which authorization to travel out of state is to commence. Each request will be forwarded to the appropriate Vice Chancellor and in turn the Chancellor for his approval and signature prior to being submitted to the Division of State Budget for approval.

Travel paid from non-state funds, including auxiliary and Special Funds, will not be affected by this policy. Also not affected by this policy is travel for which no reimbursement is to be requested.

Any person or organization needing further information concerning UNCC spending limitations should contact someone from the Chancellor's office.


