Diana Ross comes to Charlotte

Diana Ross will appear at the Charlotte Coliseum April 17 as part of her first solo tour of the US. The show she will perform has received rave reviews and broken almost every attendance record at both Los Angeles' Universal Amphitheatre and New York City's Radio City Music Hall.

It is especially designed for the largest halls across the country and includes a 50-piece orchestra, 13 singers and nine dancers, rear screen projections and laser beams. Fashion designer genius Bob Mack-

ie helped Ross create the array of costumes she will wear.

Ross is a recipient of Broadway's Tony Award for "An Evening with Diana Ross," a show which played to sellout audiences in New York, Boston, Chicago and Philadelphia. She received an Academy Award nomination for her portrayal of Billie Holiday in 1972's *Lady Sings the Blues* and can be seen currently in Motown's *The Wiz*.

Ross will perform most of her hit songs in the concert, including some from her days with

the Supremes: "Baby Love," "Stop! In the Name of Love" and "I Hear a Symphony." Musical numbers from her movies, *Lady Sings the Blues*, *Mahogany* ("Do You Know Where You're Going To") and *The Wiz* ("Ease On Down the Road") are also scheduled.

The backup group for the evening will be Roger and Roger, a comic impressionist/singer duo who have performed on Don Kirshner's "Rock Concert," "America 2Nite," Merv Griffin and Mike Douglas.
