it has a mid-range trajectory of .6 of an inch, and at 200 yards, 2.5 inches. This cartridge has also been adopted by the North Atlantic Treaty Organization to help standardize its small arms system. It is also thinking strongly of adopting the new M14 rifle.

The new rifle has a few characteristics of the old Grand. The main one of these is the action. It is gas operated and has been shortened to accept the new shell and modified to accommodate a 20 round clip. To the rear, on the right hand side of the receiver, a button has been added so that the rifle may switch from semi- to fully automatic fire. The standard issue will be semi-automatic only; however, a heavier-barreled model that will replace the existing B.A.R. will be able to alternate its fire.

The barrel has been shortened and some wood removed around the forend to reduce weight. The overall weight saving is about one pound less than the Grand's 9.6 pounds.
