SHORT STATE STRIPS.

There are 285 penitentiary convicts at work at Rocky Mount, building a stockade.

The trial of Will and Tom Whitson, brothers, for the murder of Kit Byrd in Mitchell county ten years ago, has just ended at Bakersville and resulted in a verdict of murder in the first degree.

Unknown persons broke into the distillery warehouse of William Wray, near King's Mountain and stole 530 gallons of whiskey.

During a severe rain and wind storm at Rock Mount, T. A. Braswell & Son's four-story tobacco prize house collapsed. The rain damaged the stock.

A cyclone swept through Bertie county, wrecking all the business houses on Wiley Askew's farm. It levelled the trees on William Pritchard's place.

Fifteen Hundred People in Distress.

Little Rock, Ark., May 24.—A telegram from Castoria, thirty miles from this city, says: Fifteen hundred men, women and children are

water-bound, and ask that boats be sent to their rescue.

The relief committee will forward a carload of provisions this morning by special train to the nearest point on the Valley Railroad, where a steamboat will be in waiting to receive the supplies and distribute them to the sufferers.

Fish Hook in Her Throat.

Lancaster, Pa., May 24.—While Mrs. Benjamin Diehl, of Helm, was engaged in tying fish hooks to outline links, last evening, her 3 years old daughter swallowed one of the hooks, which lodged in her throat nearly choking the child.

The mother's efforts to remove the hook only forced it further down the throat. The child is now lying in a critical condition.

A Broken Neck Mended.

Holyoke, Mass., May 20.—Mary A. Williams, aged 70 years, dislocated her neck by a fall on last Saturday, and created a surprise by refusing to die at once. Today five doctors set her broken vertebra, and the old lady can move her head without any discomfort whatever.
