Melons, Ice and Other Perishable Melons, Ice and Other Perishable
Goods Cannot Lawfully be sold on sunday.
A prohibitory law bas been un earthed to stop Sundar trading by the merchants of the town. law mas hased in 1880 . Th never been enforced 1886 and has yer been enforced.
At the meeting of the board of ommissioners to night parties wil consult the anthorities and ask tha the following ordinance be strictl enforced, which will stop the sale o cigars, tobacco, melons, e'c., on Sunday :'

"Ordinance No. 25. That any per son or persons who shall sell on the Sabbath day, within the corporate limits of sald town, except medicine, or in case of necessity, any article of trade or merchandise, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conyiction thereof shall be for each and every offence finéd five or each and every offence fined fiv dollars or imprisoned for five days. Merchants in all parts of the city have violated this ordinance. Sun-
day has not been properly observed, it is claimed, and has been made feast day since the melon season n. If enforced, the drag store will not have the cinch on the Sunm day cigar and tobacco trade, as heretofore.
