To those who contemplate going fishing on election day we would appeal in our most earnest toves, do not leave us to strive agains; hope for the defeat of all that is essen tially Republican, fccused in the very name McKinlev. If you are wiser than the party, don't take wisdom from us. If you are stronger than we, do stay with us and help us out of our troubles. If you are great, do atay with us and mould us into your proportions. To stand aside $w$ hile the help oi every one is so much needed, sug gests inconstancy. To be overcome oy the unomalies of the situation gives rise to a suspicion of weak ness in a degree almost equal to those whise weakness disgust jou. We see how unwise and how detris mental to party autonemy it was for those who imagised themselves too wise avd too patriotic to stay in Democratic hnes and now find themselves absorbed by a spirit of aniagonism toward their former nolitical family and unable to recon ale themselves to a return to wher they might do something for, not against themselyes, don'c let us see qual folly on the other exireme. But for the characteristic pra sumption of the Popuists that the Democrats would take down Sewal for Tom Watson, and the ambition to defeat Democracs ac the cost of the defeat of their own pet schemcs in nominating Tom Watson ou chances uould be fairly bright to elect Mr. Bryan.
State fusion with the Populists has happily been averted (thanks to Marion Butler for one good act) Therd are now enough chances to win all along the lime to rally our disheartened and demoralized ranks, Let there be no faltering but all keep well abreast and go forward to win. If we should fail we will be in better shape to secure victory at some other time. There is no good in dividıng.
