"It stands to-day for all that the American people do not want."

"It stands for what benefits the bond-gamblers of Wall street."

It stands for protection to American laborers' one day in the year, and then legislate against them the other 364 days.

It stands for the wealth consumers and against the wealth producers.

It stands for 10 cent corn, 30 cent wheat and 5 cent cotton.

It stands for the policy of making the poor man pay the bulk of taxes while the rich go free of taxation.

It stands for two kinds of money—one for the bondholder and gold gambler and the other for the farmer, mechanic and old pensioner.

It stands for high taxes and low wages.

It stands for a policy that has

filled our jails and almshouses.

It stands for landlordism on one hand and pauperism on the other.

It stands for the doctrine that the rights of property are superior to the rights of person.

It stands for financial policy which a trial of years has brought the country to the verge of ruin.

It stands for gold monometalism, a conspiracy which in the language of Secretary Carlisle "will ultimately entail more misery upon the human race than all the wars, pestilence and famines that have ever occurred in the history of the world."

### Evils of the Coffee Habit.

There is an outcry in America and on the European Continent against coffee drunkenness, which is said to be one of the latest dangers. A New York doctor, who has made a special study of the subject, says his observation has shown beyond question that chronic coffee poisoning is much more common than is generally supposed: "The symptoms are usually confounded with alcoholic disturbance, because coffee dyspepsia bears a striking resemblance to alcoholic dyspepsia. There is the same disgust for food, morning expectorations of mucus, and marked anorexia. This disgust for food increases in severe cases, until the patient can only take coffee, or bread soaked in coffee. Nausea follows, and many of the other ills that flesh is heir to. Concerning the same evil, Dr. Mendil, of Berlin, has published a clinical study which is the most thorough yet made, as he had a community of coffee drinkers under his constant observation—the workingman in and about Essen. He found many of these women consume over a pound of coffee a week. The leading symptoms of the ills that afflicted them were profound depression of spirits and frequent headaches, with insomnia. A strong dose of coffee would relieve them for a time, when the ailment would return. The muscles became weak and trembling, and the hands trembled when at rest. The victims suffered so seriously that they dared not abandon the drinking of coffee for fear of death."—Exchange.

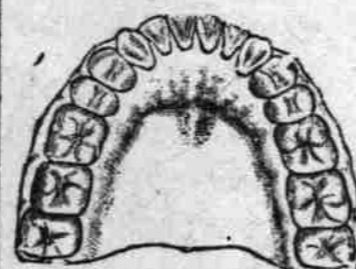
