How a Letter May Be Recalled.

Many times people would like to recall a letter after it has been mailed. This can be done, even if the letter has reached the post office at its destination. At every postoffice there are what is called "withdrawal blanks." On application they will be furnished and when a deposit is made to cover the expense, the postmaster will telegraph to the postmaster at the letter's des\_ tination asking that it be promptly returned. The applicant first signs tuis agreement: "It is hereby agreed tnat, if the letter is returned to me, I will protect you from any and all claims made against you for such return and will fully indemnify you for any loss you may sustain by reason of such action. And I herewith deposit \$- to cover all expenses incurred and will deliver to you the envelope of the letter reurned." In many cases persons have made remittances to fraudulent parties or irresponsible firms, not earning their true character until after the letter had gone, and have succeeded in recalling them. There PRODUCE is an instance where a Kansas City merchant had remitted a dishonest by means of a withdrawal rescued the draft just in time.-Globe Democrat.

A Christmas Fruit Cake.
