## MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS.

**J. L. Crowell Elected Mayor** By a Majority of 96 Over L. D. Duval—Others Elected.

The most interesting election that has ever been held in this city took place Tuesday, which resulted in the election of a decidedly mixed ticket. The race for mayor was a hot one and a well earned triumph for the successful candidates.

Mr. James Lee Crowell was elected Mayor by a majority of 96 votes over Mr. Louis D Duval. The votes by wards were as follows:

First Ward—Duval 167; Crowell 130 Aldermen: M C Walter 159, H I Woodhouse 174, A S Dayvault 135, L D Coltrane 130; School Commissioners J J Payseur 152, W R Odell 140.

Second Ward—Duval 46, Crowell 234; Aldermen: W A Wilkinson 244, R F Coble 239, D M Furr 41, J C Wadsworth 29; School Commissioner: D B Coltrane 239, L M Archey 47

Third Ward—Duval 34, Crowell 23, Klutz 4, Aldermen: G L Patterson 32, R A Brown 30, J L Brown 22, J K Patterson 39 School Commissioner J A Cline 59

Fourth Ward—Duval 135, Crowell 91, Klutz 2. Aldermen: C A Cook 88, J M Alexander 88, A B Young 141, T C Stricker 123, G T Crowell 14 School Commissioner T Chapman 85, D B Morrison 140.
