### Shooting at Morehead.

The Newbern Journal of June 26th says: There was a shooting affair at the Atlantic Hotel at Morehead on Thursday morning, between a young man named Wooten, of La Grange, and a friend named Slocumb, of Greensboro, in which one of the shots fired by Wooten at Slocumb took effect in the calf of the leg of a bystander named Merritt.

The difficulty occurred in the bar of the hotel and arose over a disputed note from a lady friend in the possession of one of the men and claimed by the other. From the statements of witnesses it appears that both of the men were under the influence of liquor.

Wooten fired two shots. The first passed just above the shoulder of Slocumb, going through his coat and vest. The second shot lodged in a bystander's leg causing him, it is said, to become quite angry. Wooten was arrested and released on bail.

Slocumb passed through Newbern yesterday and stopped off long enough for a drink. He took the matter quite coolly and remarked that if the first bullet had gone a few inches lower he would have been carried home in a box.
