Passes Away Wednesday at 1:15 at the State Hospital-His Body in State manSaints Church-Faneral Services at 10 a. ... Friday-His Career as Statesman, Soldier and Explorer -A Good Ripe Age.

At 1.15 o'clock p. m., Wednesday, Gen. T L C ingman yielded the last ungering spark of life at the Morganton Hospital. By request of Mr. J C Gibson, who e wife is the nicce of the deceased, the body was tent to Concord, and arrived in our eity Wednesday night. It is today To sate in the Episcopal church, where the funeral services will be conducted Friday morning at 10 o'clock, by Rev. Dr. Davis, after which the remains will be interred at the city cemetery.

Gen. Cliogman bas been a conspicuous figure in our State and has stood far above the mediocrity.






