Most of the excuses received by teachers read thus: "Please excuse John for absence yesterday." This is no excuse, and will not be so regarded in fu ure. An excuse must state Cause of absence, and no cause is sufficient save sickness, as before stated. Parents keep children at home sometimes to do necessary w rk, but they should remember that no work is so necessary or important as attending school. One day's abs nce may lose what may not be regained in many days, and the one day's work at home loses its importance when compared with the work of the school year.
