Outlining their Platform.

The National Organization Committee of the Populist party met in St. Louis on the 24th. It appointed a meeting of the same committee in the same place for January 11, 1898, and recommended a national nominating convention on the first Wednesday in April, 1898 and State conventions on the third Wednesday in March. It recommended holding Congressional conventions after the national convention.

The outlines of the platform were indicated as follows:

1. Absolute paper money, based upon every commodity and resource of the nation, a full legal tender, and receivable for all dues of the United States.

2. Free coinage of gold and silver at the present legal ratio; the coin debt of the United States payable in either at the option of the government.

3. All money to be issued by the government and paid out direct to the people for services rendered, or to be loaned to them at a low rate of interest on safe security, and without the intervention of private banks, provided that the volume of currency shall not exceed \$50 per capita.

4. Government ownerships and operation of railroads, telegraph and telephone lines.

5. Opposition to alien ownership and holding of land for speculative purposes.

6. Opposition to court-made laws.

7. Opposition to trusts.

8. We especially recommend the initiative and referendum and the imperative mandate."
