Section 1. That article 6 of the constitution of North Carolina be, and the same is hereby repoaled, and in lieu thereof shall be substitued the following article o said constitution

ARTICLE VI.
Suffrage and Eligibility to OficeQualifications of an Elector. Secton 1. Every malo person born in the United States, and every male person who has been aturalized, 21 years of age and possessing the qualifications set out in this article shall be entitled to vote at any election by the people in the State, except herein therwise provided
Section 2. He shall reside in he State of North Carolina for two years, in the countysix months, and in the precinct, ward or other election district in which he offers to vote four monthe next preceding the election; provided, that removal trom one precinct ward or other election district, to another in same county, shall not operate to deprive any person of the right to vote in the precinct, ward or other election district, from which he has removed until four months after such removal No person who has been convictNo person who has bis in open court upon indictment, of in open court apon indiciment, the punishment, of any crime, the punishment, of
which is, or may hereafter be imwhich is, or may hereatter be imprisonment in the State prisos,
shall be permitted to vote unless the said person shall be first restored to citizenship in the manner preseribed by law.
Section 3. Every person offering to vote shall be at the time a legally registered voter as hereinafter preseribed by law, and the General Assembly of North Carolina shall enact general registration laws to carry into effect the provisions of this article.
Section 4. Every person preSection 4. Every person pre-
senting himself for registration shall be able to read and write any section of the constitution in any section of the constitution in
the English language; and, in addition thereto shall have paid on or before the first day of March, of the year in which he proposes to vote, his poll tax, as prescribed by law, for the previons year, and he shall exhibit his receipt there for when he offers to vote. Pol Taxes shall be a lien only on as sessed property, and no proces shall be issued to enforce the collection of the same except agains assessed property
Section 5. No male person, who was on January 1, 1867, or at any time prior thereto, entitled to vote under the laws of any State in the United States wherein he then resided, and no lineal descendant of any such porson, shall be denied the rikht to reg ister and vote at any election in this State by reason of his failure to possess the educational qualiff cations prescribed in section 40 this article: provided, he sha have registered in accordance
'with the terms of this article prior
to December 1, 1908, and no person shall be entitled to re ister under this section after that date The General Assembly shall at its first session after the adoption this amendment, propide th manner in which the classes of persons provided for in this ion shall register.
Seocion. 6. All elections by the petiple shall be by ballot, and all elections by the General Assembly hall be viva voce.
Section. 7. Eyery voter in North Carolina, except at in this article disqualified, shall be eligible to office, bat before entering apon the duties of the office he shall take and subscribe the following oath: "I, ———, do solemnly swear or affirm that I will support and maintain the constitution and constitntio United States and the Carolination and laws of North and that I will faithfoll dish the duties of my office ss So help me God."
Setion. 8. The following classes of persons shall be disqualified or office: First, all personaline deny the being of Al persons who deny the being of Almighty God. been convicted, or confessed their been convicted, or confessed their
guilt on indictment pending, and whether sentenced or not, or ander judgement suspended; of any treason or felony, or any other crime for which the punishment may be imprisonment in the penitentiary, since becoming citizens of the United States, of corruption and malpractice in office, unless such person shall be restored to the rights of citizenship in a manner prescribed by law.
