The bale was grown at Sinton, Texas, and was donated to the flood sufferers by a New Orleans cotton house, which paid a premium of one hundred dollars and the full market price for the bale. It will be passed from exchange throughout the country and it is expected that many thousands of dollars will be realized by successive auctions of the bale.
