The Panama Canal.

It is stated on good authority that the interests of the French stockholders in the Panama canal have been purchased by citizens of the United States and that the work of construction will proceed with greater vigor.

The capital stock of the company will be increased at once from \$20,000,000 to \$120,000,000.

A representative of the new company said recently that "the cost of the completion of the work is estimated at \$100,000,000; that one-half of the total cost, has already been expended;" that the route is regarded as the best and that the purpose of the company is to press the work to completion at the earliest practicable date.

In spite of the disastrous failure of the De Lesseps company, there are many eminent engineers who contend that the Panama canal can be completed at much less expense than the Nicaraguan canal could be constructed and that the former would have many other advantages over the latter.

A great part of the work done at Panama by the original company is still good and so is much of the machinery that was bought and used by that company.

The capitalists who are behind the Panama canal have absolute confidence in the success of their great enterprise and say that they neither need nor desire assistance.

The prospects of the Panama canal were never before so good and we shall not be surprised to see it completed before the Nicaragua canal is begun. Then would it be profitable to construct the Nicaragua canal at all?—Atlanta Journal.
