Supreme Court to dismiss the same case hat Clark and his agents ongaged in wholesale bribery and attempt at bribery in the legis lature
The committee finds proven beyond a question a number of men named who received sums aggrègating $\$ 207,390$, while di ect and carcumstantial evidence stablish the further list of names with amounts aggregating $\$ 105$, 00.
