CLARK A GIANT CORRUPTIONIST.

A Washington dispatch of the 27th gives some startling findings by the committee on privileges and elections in the investigations of Senator Clark's election to the United States Senate.

The committee find that 15 members of the legislature were paid by Mr. Clark or his agents for their votes; that money was offered to at least nine others aggregating the sum of \$175,000; that \$100,000 was offered by one Dr. Treacy, a friend of Clark, to the attorney general to dismiss proceedings in court; that the same agent offered \$100,000 to Justice Hunt of the Supreme Court to dismiss the same case; that Clark and his agents engaged in wholesale bribery and attempt at bribery in the legislature.

The committee finds proven beyond a question a number of men named who received sums aggregating \$207,390, while direct and circumstantial evidence establish the further list of names with amounts aggregating \$105,500.

To offset this the senator raises the cry of persecution and hate and the buying up of the press of the State to hound him down.

It is something of a comfort to know that when bribery and corruption get so bold as to threaten our institutions there comes the strong hand of virtue to call a halt.

It is to be hoped that the United States Senate will rid itself of this corruptionist Clark. Of course he will squeal.
