New Orleans Murderer Charles Kills Four More Mon and Wounds Several. Then Diss-Bloody Epoch for the Cresent City.

The last of the New Orleans trouble was like a fatal clap at the close of a thunder storm.

It was learned that the negro Charles, who had killed Officers Day and Lamb, was in a house in the city. Officers went to arrest him and without warning he opened fire and killed one and fatally wounded another. While a Catholic Priest was ministering to the dying man a boy standing by the priest was killed by a shot from Charles. 'Later he killed another man and fatally wounded four and injured several others.

Charles was firing from a second story window. It was decided to burn him out, so a can of oil and a match was applid.

He came out to change locations and was killed. His body was riddled with bullets.

There were several other negroes gotten out of the house later and locked up, one being killed while resisting arrest. present. With this terrible tragedy the New Orleans riot seems now over.


