A Durham Oprrative cauzh in a Butt-- His kisht Leg Fgrin of aţ the Hip Jont-a Horrible Scuse
Durhum, Jat. 17.-J. L "W asht, white," 34 yegrs of age, met a hosribse emif in the Erwin Mill thts afternobn about 1 o'clock. Caught in a belt his body was jerked" to "the pulley above and his right leg torn off ate the hip joint. Hellived şome eight or ten minates after the accident.
The deceased was a section foreman and it was his duty to see that the belts were all on when the mill started. When the fatal accident occurred he was putting on a belt with his foot, throwing it on the machine pulley, when his leg became tangled in the belt and his body was jerked quickly to the ceiling.
The limb was wound around the shafting and torn loose at the hip joint and his body dropped to the floor. The limb remained on the shafting until, the machines were stopped and it was taken off. The machinery below was spattered with blood and a pqr. tion of his bowels were thrown some 20 feet and lodged on another . machine.. Shreds of flesh were scattered and left hanging to machinery several feet in every direction.
