The situation at the Narrows of the Yadkin is one, which has always pre sented alluring possibilities to enterprising capitalists, and several attempts have been made from time to time to organize a company to utilize the situation. There is a rapid fall of the river, some 25 feet to the mile, and at the Narrows the river is forced into a narrow gorge with banks of solid vicinity for more than 20 years, and had long been familiar with the possibilities there, finally took steps to acquire the property and to develop the water-power. There has been a long and tedious delay in the preliminary work, it having been found desirable, company, to acquire title to all of the land on both sides of the river, a distance of 13 miles in all, and the company now owns 15,000 acres in feesimple.
