CHE Foo, Feb. 9.6-The Japanese fleet attacked Port Arthur Monday. Two Russian battleships and one Russian cruiser were disabled by torpedoes.

JAPAN OPENS THE

The Columbia was lying in the road stead, surrounded by 14 Russian battle-ships and cruisers." At 11:80 o'clock Monday night a severe shock was felt on board the Columbia. The Russians inimediately commenced to operate their searchlights and opened fire towards the sea. The firing lasted only a short time. At 1 o'clock more shocks were felt and the Russians again commenced firing.

They were soon followed by a Russian cruiser which also was beached. None of the vessels were damaged above the water line. More shocks from torpedoes were felt during the early morning and then all was quiet.

> At 10 o'clock Tuesday morning three Japanese cruisers passed Port Arthur in sight of the Russian fleet. The whole Russian fleet immediately weighed anchor and went after them, but returned in half an hour.
