

EMPLOYEES SHARE MILL'S PROFITS.

New Plan Inaugurated By Textile Company at Durham Pays First Award to Operatives.

Durham, Jan. 18.—One of the Durham textile companies which announced a profit-sharing plan for its employees six months ago, this morning announced the first awards from the plan, whereby \$1,172 has been distributed to the various employees of the mill.

When the plan was announced last September a number of prizes were offered for suggestions from employees of improvements that could be made.

For these suggestions \$57.50 has been awarded six employees, the prizes running for \$20.00 down to \$2.50. One of the oldest employees was given \$25.00 for long and faithful service, another of the older workers in the mill was awarded \$13.00.

In addition to these prizes there has been invested in preferred stock of this mill, \$1,076.50, as the beginning of a fund for the benefit of old employees, in the shape of sick and death benefits.

RAILROAD OVER SEA BEING COMPLETED.

Flagler Road From Miami to Key West Will Be Finished in a Month.

Atlanta Journal. Railroad officials in Atlanta have received a circular announcing the opening of the Flagler railroad over the sea from Miami, Fla., to Key West, on January 20, and the attendant celebration in the latter city.

The road has been completed from Miami to Knights Key, 11 miles, for some time, and now the last of the work to Key West is about finished and the line will be formally opened on January 20.

The Flagler road is considered one of the greatest engineering feats of the age, particularly the last 48 miles of it, Knights Key to Key West.

Only one of the many Florida keys is touched in this distance, the remainder of the line being piers erected over the water.

The distance from Key West to Havana, Cuba, is only 90 miles, and railroad officials here predict that in the course of the next year huge barges will carry long trains to the Cuban port.

If this prediction is realized, passengers can enter a Pullman car in New York and not leave it until they are in Havana. In the same way the expense of handling freight several times will be eliminated, as cars billed for Havana can be carried to their destination on the barges and unloaded there.

From January 20 to February 3, Key West will celebrate the opening of the railroad to that place, and reduced rates to that city will be put on from all points in the United States.

He Shot Three Serenaders.

A. M. Huff evidently has an ear for music and is also a good shot with a shotgun. 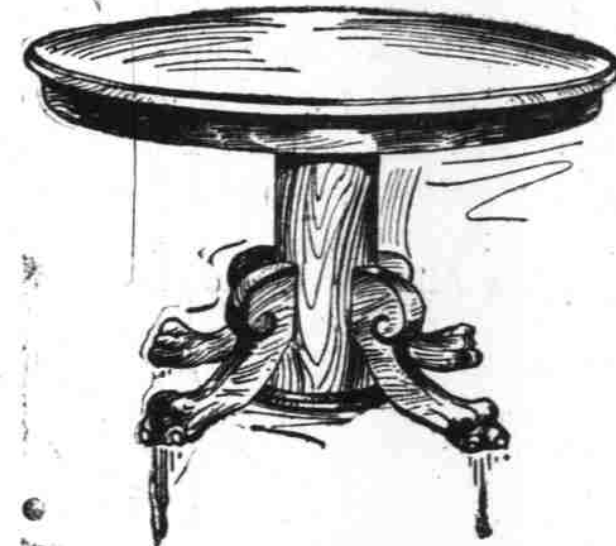

Morse is a Free Man.

Washington, Jan. 18.—President Taft today commuted to expire immediately the 15-year sentence for violation of the national banking laws under which Charles W. Morse, the New York banker and "ice king," served two years in the federal penitentiary at Atlanta, Ga. The commutation of sentence, which gives Morse his complete freedom—but which, unlike a pardon, does not restore his civil rights—was granted upon recommendation of Attorney General General Wickersham and Surgeon General Torney, U. S. A. According to the Surgeon-General's report to the President on his condition, Morse could not live one month longer in confinement and even at liberty probably would not live six months.
