Negro Reported Killed at Mine.

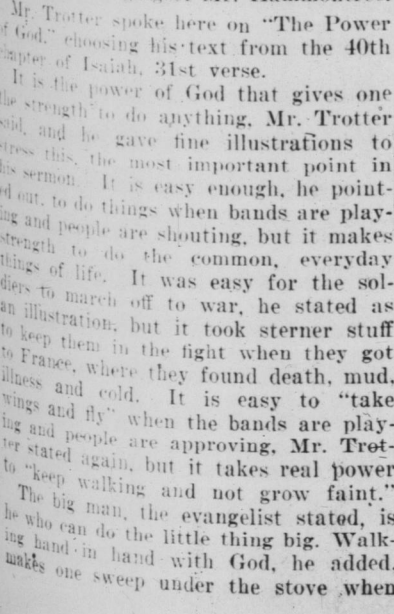

GOVERNOR MORRISON IS SPEAKER AT DAVIDSON

Enforcement of South's Armistice Day Expressed in Wilson's Armistice Day Address in the Address.

Davidson, Nov. 12.—Enforcement of the sentiment expressed by former President Wilson in his Armistice Day address and extended discussion of his views on the foreign policies of the American government were included in the address by Governor Cameron Morrison of North Carolina, before the assembly celebrating the opening of a state highway, the Armistice Day and Davidson College Founders' Day.

"There never has been and never will be a middle ground position for the United States in respect to our international relations," said Governor Morrison. "We either ought to have walked right into the League of Nations and from a front seat help organize the world for peace and everlastingly against war, or should have boldly declared that the war was over and we denied all responsibility for world affairs, and would return to our isolation, and view, possibly with some concern but without responsibility, the struggle of a lacerated world to heal itself."
