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TWO ROBBERS WILL DIE FOR SLAYING OF HOTEL EMPLOYEE

Two of 5 Men Who Robbed Fashionable Drake Hotel in Chicago and Killed Cashier, Found Guilty.

INSANITY PLEA DID NOT WORK

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REPLACING SCRUB BULLS

A Total of 195 Bulls Placed in Fifteen Counties.

Raleigh, Sept. 17.—(AP)—A total of 195 bulls was placed in fifteen counties of piedmont North Carolina by farm agents of State College...

A complete cattle census of the counties was taken. In taking the census, the workers visited the individual farms and discussed the value of purebred bulls with the owners.

The defects of the scrub bulls were also pointed out, and in many cases the farmers bought purebred bulls during the taking of the census.

Campaigns were put on in Alamance, Randolph, Iredell, Rowan, Davidson, Forsyth, Mecklenburg, Union, Cleveland, Catawba, and Gaston counties.

County Agent W. Kerr Scott, of Alamance, won first prize and will be awarded a silver trophy cut offered by the American Jersey Cattle Club.

The second prize went to Ewing Millsaps, county agent in Randolph, who, in addition to half his expenses to the dairy show, will receive a silver trophy cut offered by the National Guernsey Cattle Association.

The third largest number of bulls was placed by R. W. Graeber, of Iredell county.

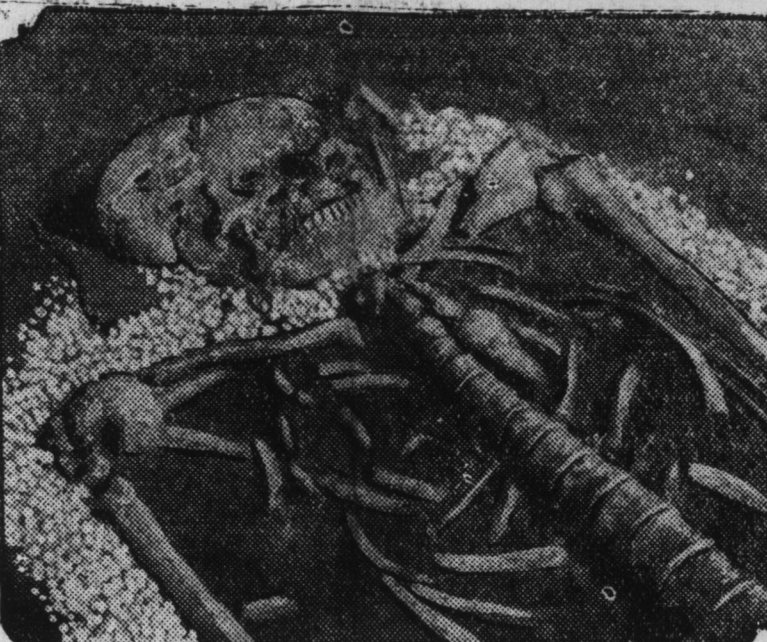

BOTTOM OF WELL 800 FEET DEEP DYNAMITED

Experiment Made at Elon College in Hopes of Making Cistern Yield a Greater Flow.

Burlington, Sept. 16.—Two hundred and fifty sticks of dynamite were set off 800 feet under ground in a well at Elon College yesterday...

A. C. Linberg, local engineer, stated the experiment of dynamiting the bottom of the well was considered worth trying because it might loosen the rock and rupture water veins near but not emptying into the well.

The well was flowing 25 to 30 gallons a minute when the experiment was tried. It is believed the explosion may have given it a slight increase, although to what extent has not been determined.

Elon College in the past has gotten its water supply from the college deep well. The growth of the college has levied an increased demand and several months ago the town started to sink a well.

A heavy rumble rolled up with the detonation, sending a geyser 200 feet above the surface. An hour later the water rose to the surface, boiling and bubbling from the terrific heat of the explosion.

Florida Swamped With Building Material

New York, Sept. 17.—(AP)—A temporary embargo on movement of houses, furniture, building material and machinery to Florida points was announced today by several of the railroad and steamship lines serving that territory.

The restriction is to hold until congestion now existing at most traffic centers in Florida has been relieved.

Woman's Home at Albemarle Is Dynamited; Her Son Accused

Albemarle, Sept. 16.—One of the most cold-blooded attempts at murder ever perpetrated in the history of Stanly county was that last night when some one, thought to be the woman's son, fired a stick of dynamite under the home of Mrs. Jane Mite...

The explosion took place between 10:30 and 11 o'clock, and was so severe that it was heard all over the city, although the circumstances were known to only a few Albemarle people until this morning.

As soon as the explosion was heard the local police got on the job, with Sheriff R. N. Furr. The sheriff and a deputy started immediately for Thomasville, the home of Will Broadway, son of the woman whose home was dynamited...

Broadway, who is a married man about 30 years old, told the sheriff, it is said, that he had been at the home of an uncle, and that he left there about 9 o'clock. The sheriff took him to the home of the uncle and was told by him that Broadway left his home about 5 o'clock yesterday afternoon instead of at 9 o'clock last night...

A Deliberate Attempt Looking at the wrecked home, one can't have a doubt as to the intent of the person who dynamited it. The head of the bed in which Mrs. Broadway was sleeping was immediately over the place where the wreck was fired. The iron bed was wrecked, the railing having been twisted into a corkscrew. The bed was turned over, the mattress torn in pieces and set on fire.

Fate Of Unification Will Be Known Soon

At Conference of Methodist Episcopal Church, South, Fate of Proposal May Be Decided.

VOTING IS CLOSE AT THE PRESENT

Various Conferences in the South Already Have Taken Action on the Proposed Merger.

Nashville, Tenn., Sept. 17.—(AP)—The fifteenth conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, which meets in October with the Holston and Louisville conference which convene September 30th, will largely determine the success or failure of the pending plan of Methodist unification.

The Holston is the first of Bishop Edwin Mounson's conferences to convene. The result in the Tennessee and Memphis, the other two conferences over which the unification leader had jurisdiction, is said to be extremely doubtful.

In the Kentucky conference which met recently the merger plan was lost by one vote, the poll being 87 for, and 88 against. Bishop U. V. W. Darlington, one of the 5 minority bishops opposed the plan, is president of the two conferences in Kentucky.

The Western North Carolina conference convenes at Statesville October 14th.

Flint, Mich., Sept. 17.—(AP)—The Detroit conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church today voted 229 to two for unification with the Methodist Episcopal Church, South.

Admission of laymen to the future sessions also was approved.

DISCHARGED FOR NOEL'S ESCAPE

Newark, N. J., Sept. 17.—(AP)—Dr. John M. Thompson, senior resident physician at Overbrook Hospital, was discharged today by the Essex county board of freeholders, who had held him responsible for the escape of Harrison Noel, confessed double murder and kidnapper. Dr. Thompson had refused to resign and had threatened suit in connection with the board's findings.

PLANS FOR FUNDING FRANCE'S DEBT TO BE OUTLINED SOON

Conferences Will Be Started in Capital One Week From Today After the French Officials Arrive.

MEET FRENCHMEN IN NEW YORK CITY

Plans for Meeting Thursday Will Give the French One Entire Day After Arrival to Perfect Plans.

Washington, Sept. 17.—(AP)—Negotiations for the funding of France's \$4,000,000,000 debt to the United States will begin here one week from today.

Acting Secretary Winston of the Treasury, the Secretary of the American debt commission, issued a call today for a meeting of the American commission at 10 o'clock next Thursday morning, by which time the French mission headed by Finance Minister Caillaux will have arrived in Washington.

The President has asked Mr. Winston and Myron T. Herrick, American Ambassador to France, to meet the French mission in New York. French Ambassador Daeschner also will be there.

Plans contemplate an immediate trip from New York to Washington and this will permit the French delegation to have next Wednesday to prepare for the formal meeting the next day.

Meantime Treasury experts and members of the American commission are gathering all data having a bearing on the French economic and physical position. The Treasury now has 10 volumes representing individual and unofficial studies bearing on the French capacity to pay.

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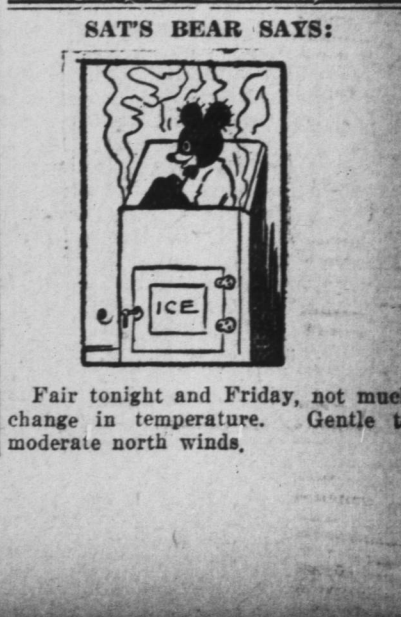
