Was At One Time Presiding Elder Of This Circuit Of the M. E. Church — Well Known In Danbury.

Rev. Dr. Paul J. Carraway, whose home was in Greensboro, passed away on last Wednesday morning, after a lingering illness. Dr. Carraway was at one time Presiding Elder for this district and was well known here. He was in the eighty-third year of his age and had never abandoned active work in the ministry. This year he was serving the charge at White Oak, to which he was appointed by the last session of the Conference, of which he was the oldest member. He is survived by his wife and a number of children.
