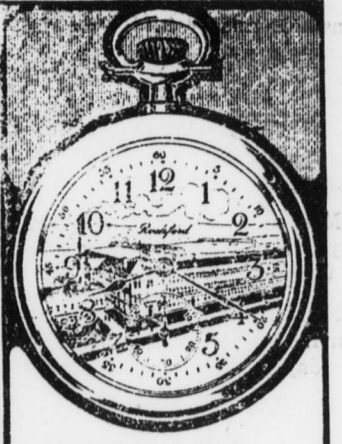
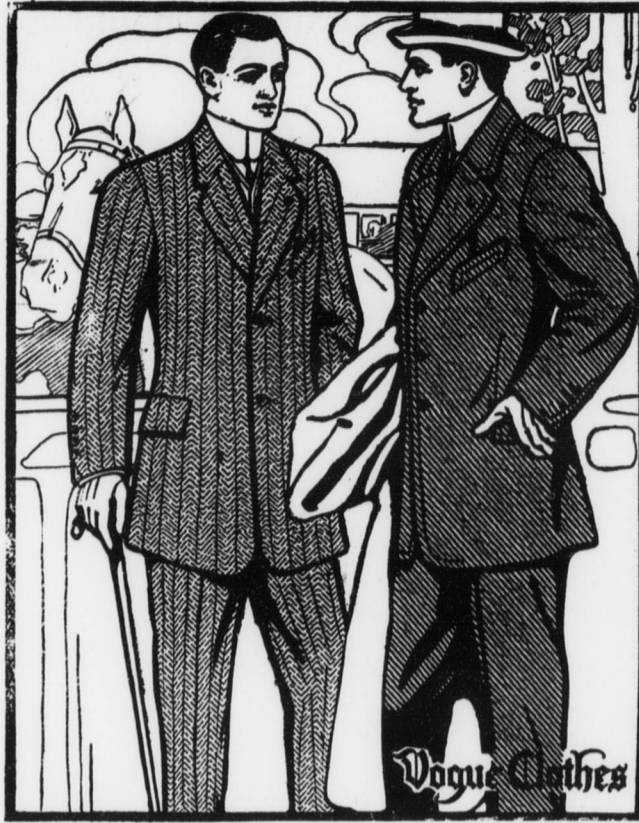

Farmers' Union Encourages Growing of Grain On Stokes County Farms.

Westfield, Sept. 25.

Mr. Editor:

At a meeting of the Farmers' Union in this county last summer, it was decided in the convention to offer prizes on corn, wheat, and oats, to be grown by Union men in the county as follows:

1. Best acre of corn \$15.
2. Second best acre of corn \$10.
3. Third best acre of corn \$5.
4. Best acre of oats \$15.
5. Second best acre of oats \$10.
6. Third best acre of oats \$5.

The same amount to be paid on wheat. Any man who is a member of the union in good standing may compete for one or all of the prizes. Money to be paid out of the treasury of the county organization. So let's get busy, prepare our acre and win a prize.

New Comet Is Now Visible In This Section.

The new comet can now be seen any night, between 8 and 12 o'clock, by the naked eye after it is located. It is considerably larger and brighter than when first seen some nights ago. It now shows a tail which has the appearance of being about fifty feet long, although it as yet has the appearance of the rays from a searchlight. The comet is near the "big dipper," apparently fifteen feet above and a little to the left of the last star in the handle of the dipper.

Department Of Agriculture Estimates Tobacco Crop

At the State Department of Agriculture it is estimated that the tobacco crop in this state was about 16,000 acres and that the yield was around 450 to the acre, compared with 215,000 acres and 600 pounds to the acre last year. Very dry conditions at the planting season and condition far into the period of cultivation cut down greatly both acreage and the yield to the care.

A large rattle snake with seven rattles was killed on the lawn in front of the residence of Mr. W. W. King, in Danbury, Friday afternoon. The little son of Sheriff C. M. Jones came very near being bitten by the snake.

John Strader, Aged 16 Years, Accidentally Kills Himself While Hunting.

John Strader, the sixteen-year-old son of Mr. H. L. Strader, a well known farmer residing near Walnut Cove, accidentally shot and killed himself last Tuesday.

The young man was out hunting and failing to return home, search was instituted for him and some of the neighbors found the body lying in the woods back of the home, only a few hundred yards away. Investigation showed that the young man had shot himself. The gun was lying near him.

Just how the accident occurred will perhaps never be known as the boy was alone when it happened.

The young man was held high in esteem by all who knew him. He was industrious and popular. He is survived by his father, one sister and five little brothers, the mother having died two years ago.
