State News

The Yadkin river reached the highest point in six years last Wednesday.

At High Point last week the plant of the Globe Parlor Furniture Co. was destroyed by fire.

Iredell county is spending \$400,000 on the public roads of that county. A central highway is being built through the county.

The board of county commissioners in Forsyth has decided to establish at an early date a workhouse for women and youths who run counter to the law.

Postmaster J. B. Spencer of Charlotte has been indicted in 18 separate counts of the charge of detaining mail matter in the Charlotte office.

Fire, which originated from the bursting of an oil feed pipe, last week almost destroyed the large blacksmith shop of the Southern Railway Company at Spencer.

Ernest Webb, the seventeen-year-old son of George Webb, a farmer who lives near Newfound, in the western part of the state, was arrested Monday, charged with the murder of his sister the Tuesday before. The boy's parents are said to have concealed the crime, saying that the shooting of the girl was accidental; they too are under arrest.

Andrew, the 10-year-old child of Mr. Hayes Duggins, was seriously bitten by a vicious dog here one day last week. The boy's leg, breast and side were painfully lacerated in several places, necessitating the attendance of a physician, and rendering him unable to walk. The dog belonged to Rev. R. L. Doggett.

Sheriff C. M. Jones has been confined to his bed with sickness a day or two the past week but is better at this writing.


