RESULTS WAR ON THE HOOKWORM IN STATE.

98,730 Persons Treated - 54 Counties In the Rank—Exhibit At State Fair.

The Quarterly Report of Dr. J. A. Ferrell, State Director of the Hookworm Campaign, shows that during the past three months the general practitioners of the State have treated 2,512 persons and that the six District Directors in the county free dispensaries have treated 14,500, a total of 17,072 for the three months ending September 30.

At the State Fair exhibit will be given to the work in eradicating hookworm disease. It will be illustrated by the natural hookworms and other kinds of worms, charts, photographs, model closets, stereoptican pictures, literature, etc.

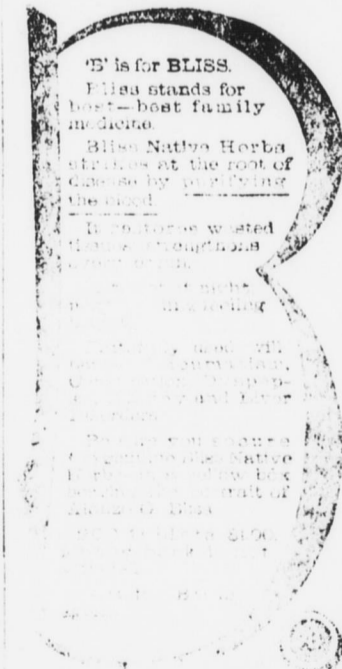
