**Tobacco Crop Practically All Sold, and Farmers Getting Ready For Another One.**

**ROAD TO FANCY GAP**

**Being Greatly Improved—Carroll County, Va., to Spend \$3,000 On It—Other Items of Interest.**

Rommy, the six-year-old of son Mr. and Mrs. R. C. Poore, on last Monday, fell from a bicycle and broke his left arm. The little fellow is getting along nicely.

The work of erecting the city's large steel tank, on Lebanon Hill, is progressing rapidly under the direction of a force of experts and it is expected to be in use inside of three weeks.

The farmers have burned a few plant beds and preparing for an unusually large crop of tobacco next season. The recent high prices insure a larger crop average than in previous years.

The tobacco crop of this section is practically sold and the warehouses are almost deserted. The local market has hardly held its own, this season, but the price has made up for the shortage in pounds.

Constable Frank Walker has returned from the mountains where he went with a posse in search of Frank Brooks and the Todd brothers who are wanted by the government. He believes that the outlaws are still in the mountains and are being hidden by their friends.

As an indication of the rapid growth of the furniture interests, in this section, one of the leading factories proposes to add forty employes this week. The demand for the Mt. Airy product makes this necessary and is a sample of what all the local factories can do.

Mrs. Hubson, who resigned as pastor of the Friends church in this city and will leave for Europe next Monday, will conduct her last service next Sunday night. Her successor, Mr. Meredith, will be present and the occasion will be one of the saddest for Mrs. Hubson is more than popular with her congregation.

The county officers and men who raided the mountain section last week in an attempt to capture the associates of Deputy Sheriff, A. J. Gorder, find that the situation was different from what they were led to believe. The raiding party was disappointed in that the men wanted to be left in the country.

Carroll county, Virginia, is now spending three thousand dollars on Fancy Gap road from the foot to the summit of the mountain and the work will be completed by the first of March. This road will be greatly improved to the North Carolina line and should Mount Airy township vote bonds, it will give a splendid highway across the mountain to the north.
