

**Death Of Mr. R. M. Campbell.**

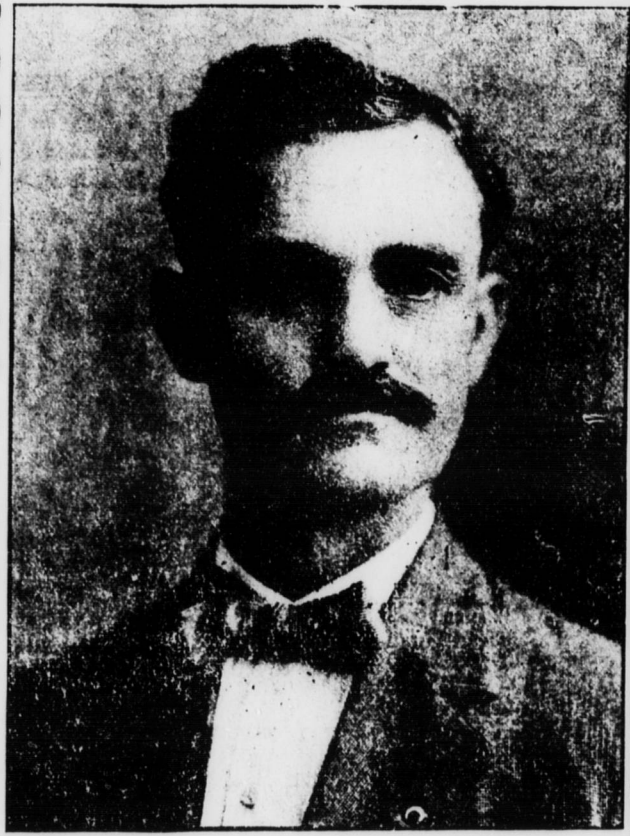
