**High Price For

but there is a shortage in Russia,
Italy, Japan and a number of
other countries, and it is esti-
mated that the world's corn crop
will be over one fifth less than
last year's crop. Here in North
Carolina the crop is fine and the
farmers are saving every grain
of it and with the prospect of
unusually high prices for their
corn crop they are not going to
waste any of it.

**High Price For
Stokes Citizen's Tobacco**

Mr. J. P. Slaughter, of the
Westfield section of Stokes, sold
1102 pounds of tobacco last week
for \$444.56, or an average of a
little more than forty cents a
pound. His best pile brought
seventy-two cents a pound. Mr.
Slaughter is one of our county's
best tobacco growers.
Mr. Slaughter holds the record
for last year, as well, for one
day during last year he sold 1512
pounds of tobacco for \$790.14,
the average price for that load
being fifty-two and one-half cents
per pound.

**Florida Land Agents
In Federal Court.**
