

MORE FACILITIES

FOR PARCEL POST

Tremendous Business Now Being Done in North Carolina.

Washington, Jan. 12.—Surprised at the parcels post traffic in North Carolina within the past year, especially during the Christmas season, and expecting that during the next Christmas season it will be three times as large, the post-office Department has ordered an investigation to determine whether the quarters in which the railway mail terminal is located at Salisbury and the proposed quarters at Raleigh will be large enough to handle the business which is expected

to pass through them during the next few years.

The terminal at Salisbury was put in operation a short time before the Christmas rush began and reports received by the Superintendent of Railway Mail Service indicate that it was of great benefit to the mail service of the State, being a great factor in making Santa Claus deliveries on time. Parcel post business during the holidays far exceeded the expectations of the department and an investigation is to be made to determine whether adjoining space should be acquired.

At Raleigh plans have almost been completed to lease quarters in a new building to be constructed. The location offered, and which the de-

partment was prepared to accept, was 30 by 33 feet square and now some doubt is expressed that 900 square feet of floor space is sufficient for the need of the service for the next few years. So a re-investigation has been ordered at Raleigh to determine if adjoining space should also be acquired there.
