DEPUTY MARSHALL RESIGNS.

Successor To Mr. Carroll Finds That Salary Is Not Sufficient.

Winston-Salem, Feb. 21.—Mr. G. M. Thompson, recently appointed U. S. deputy marshal to succeed Mr. G. A. Carroll, of this city, was in the city today. Mr. Thompson lives at Lexington, but since his appointment has made his headquarters at Rural Hall. Mr. Thompson states that upon his return home he will send in his resignation. He states that his territory is Stokes, Surry, Forsyth and Davidson counties, and that the salary is not sufficient to warrant his giving up his home and interests at Lexington, and that to retain his residence at Lexington would be a hindrance in the performance of his duties as deputy marshal.

Mr. Thompson states that there is a possibility of a change in his district, that would permit him receiving a new appointment, and that Marshal Webb is contemplating making a district of Davie, Davidson, Rowan and Stanley counties, which would place Lexington in the center of the district. While this may not be done, if it is Mr. Thompson will probably be appointed deputy marshal in this district with headquarters in his home town.

Greensboro To Be Made Parcel Post Terminal

Greensboro, Feb. 19 Local authorities have just received notification from department officials at Washington announcing that it has been definitely decided to establish a parcel post terminal at Greensboro to serve this city and surrounding sections of the State. Government officials have already secured a five-year lease on a suitable building in which to locate the terminal, and advices are that the new terminal will begin actual operations on March 1, giving employment a clerical force of ten men.

The establishment of the terminal here will mean much to Greensboro and the surrounding section, as it will insure a prompt and more efficient service to patrons of the local postoffice as well as to patrons offices in nearby territory. The Gate City was named as the point in which to establish the parcel post station over several other points in this section which were anxious to get the office.

The purpose of the new terminal according to local postal officials, is to facilitate the handling of the greatly increased parcel post business, and to eliminate as far as possible the handling of "heavy" mails while enroute in railway mail cars.

When operations begin at the new station it is believed that an efficient service will be inaugurated and that the work of handling mails will be more evenly divided among Uncle Sam's employees.

Former Governor Glenn Gets An Appointment

Former Governor R. B. Glenn was named by President Wilson to be a member of the International Joint Commission, to succeed George Turner, of Spokane, Wash., resigned. The commission was created under a treaty with Great Britain and has jurisdiction over all cases involving the use, obstruction or diversion of waters forming the international boundary or crossing the boundary between the United States and Canada. The powers of the commission extend only to making investigations, holding hearings and making recommendations.

Mr. Glenn, who was in Washington Friday night, announced that he would begin service March 1. The salary attached to this job is \$7,500. Governor Glenn may be chairman of the commission.
