

## FORSYTH'S BAD ROAD

Farmers Having Great Difficulty In Reaching Winston-Salem Tobacco Market.

### MUD TO THE AXLE

Section of Road Between the Stokes Line and Dennis Station Said To Be In Deplorable Condition.

That section of road between Dennis station and the Stokes county line at Dr. E. Fulp's has been the source of much trouble and a great deal of talk recently to farmers who have visited the Winston-Salem market with tobacco.

The building of this road, it is learned, was recently let to contract by the Forsyth county highway commissioners, but owing to a dispute as to which side of the railroad track it should be built on, the work was stopped after the road had been plowed up for a mile or more. And with the recent rains on the road in this condition it has become all but impassable even with a four-horse team.

To avoid this mile or two of bad road, those tobacco farmers who were especially favorable to the Winston-Salem market, have been compelled to reach the Twin-City by way of the Box Mountain road, which is not only an unimproved country road but is a number of miles out of the way.

It is hoped that the Forsyth authorities will take some action to improve this road. It will mean a direct loss to the Twin-City, if not Forsyth county, to let it remain as it is.
