## Guilford To Have A New Courthouse

Greensboro, Jan. 14.—The Guilford county commissioners yesterday decided upon a plan for giving the county a new courthouse building to be constructed on the spot at present occupied by the courthouse. In order to have the court room quiet, one of the complaints against it being that it is noisy, it will be several stories from the ground, accessible by electric elevators and made absolutely convenient with all modern fixtures. As contemplated the building will be eight or ten stories high, will be fire proof, and thoro modern in every particular. The cost will be from \$150,000 to \$200,000. It is estimated that the rents from offices will amount to from \$15,000 to \$20,000 per year, which sum will be placed in a sinking fund with which to retire the bonds. By this plan the building will have paid for itself in 15 or 20 years, the rents will have increased and a good income will be produced for the county.

The county offices will probably occupy the ground floor. The

floor also will have rooms suitable for department stores or banks. One of the floors will be given for a library for lawyers.

If the election to be held in Westfield township, Surry county, February 10th, results in favor of a bond issue for roads, the people of the Westfield section of this county will have a modern highway from the Stokes line at Westfield all the way to Mt. Airy.

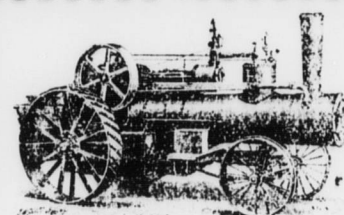

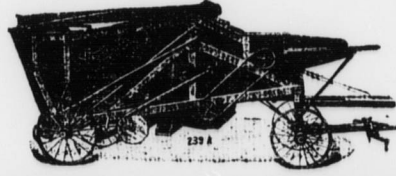
