Washington, D. C., Oct. 23 .-Pinnacle, N. C. Making a plea for the conservation of human life, President Fairfax Harrison of the Southern Railway Company states that during the fiscal year, ended June 30, 147 trespassers were killed on the tracks of the Southern Railway. Mr. Harrison urges the development of a public sentiment that will put an end to the hazardous practice of trespass-

ing on railway property. "We have prepared a map showing the point at which each trespasser was killed on the Southern Railway during the last year monuments on the Chickamauga battle-field," said Mr. Harrison. "Fully one third of those killed were school boys, 'hopping' trains, and a large percentage were valuable wage-earners, walking on the tracks to or from their work. Very few were tramps in the commonly accepted meaning of the term.
