TOBACCO MARKET

Walnut Cove, Nov. 17.—A good break of tobacco was on the warehouse floors here yesterday and good prices prevailed on the entire lot. More than 20,000 pounds of the weed was sold at an average of about ten cents. The tobacco being sold just now is not of the best quality and but for this reason the prices would be considerably better. However the farmers who were on the market here yesterday were highly pleased with their averages and many of them expressed themselves as being so well pleased with the home market of Stokes county that they expected to sell the remainder of the crop in Walnut Cove. About thirty wagons loaded with tobacco are in the warehouse today and others are coming in, indicating another splendid break today. The buyers for the American, the Export and Liggett & Myers are anxious to buy every pound they can at this point and strong competitive buying between these three firms is a feature on every sale. The merchants are co-operating with the market by placing every conceivable article of merchandise in stock and selling at a small margin of profit. In discussing the tobacco market here one farmer made this remark: "In the spring I buy my fertilizer on time in Walnut Cove, and during the long summer the merchants here extend me very reasonable credit and allow me

to buy all my supplies on time, waiting until winter to get their money without a murmur. For this reason, if no other, I shall hereafter patronize the Walnut Cove tobacco market. My other reason is this: I can sell it as high here as I can anywhere." This was a conscientious, hard-working farmer, with a head that sets level on his square shoulders, and a heart that beats in the right spot. He believes in standing by the folks who stand by him; he is loyal to his home county and is willing to become instrumental in establishing new industries for the development of the section where he was born and reared. There are hundreds of his type in Stokes county and they are the factors which are going to build a market in Walnut Cove.

I will be at morning appointments from 9 to 12 and evening appointments from 1 to 4 and all other appointments from 10 to 3 o'clock.

The General Assembly of 1915 made a very material change in the law relative to the time of collection and settlement of taxes, to which I most respectfully call the attention of the tax-payers of Stokes county.

Under this change the State taxes have to be settled in full during the month of January, 1916, and the County and School taxes during the month of February, 1916, and property may be levied on and sold for the taxes of 1915, on and after the first day of November, 1915.

The time for the collection and settlement of the taxes for 1915 has been much shortened by the above law, and I most respectfully request the tax-payers of the county to meet me at the above times and places and pay their taxes for 1915. I must do my duty in the matter, and have to settle the taxes in accordance with law, and urge the tax-payers to pay at once and save costs and trouble. Do not think you can neglect this matter, for you cannot, and not be put to trouble and cost, but make your arrangements and pay, and get your taxes off your hands. You are liable for cost after Nov. 1st. This Oct. 21st, 1915.
