A Thanksgiving Thought.

Good Things For The Thanksgiving Dinner.

Chicken Salad.

Meat of one chicken chopped fine; one teacupful of finely chopped cabbage; one teaspoonful of celery seed; whites of 5 hard boiled eggs chopped fine; one small onion chopped fine.

Dressing For Salad.

Yolks of 5 eggs mashed into a paste and mixed with the following:

One teaspoonful of mustard; 1/2 teaspoonful pepper; 1/2 teaspoonful of salt; 1 teaspoonful of sugar; 1/2 cup of melted butter; 1/2 cup of vinegar. Beat rapidly while mixing and if too dry add more dressing.

Candied Sweet Potatoes.

Boil or stew large potatoes until nearly done, then peel and cut in slices, not quite half an inch thick; place in a baking dish with a little water. Spread each slice with butter, sprinkle with sugar and bake until brown.

Chocolate Cake.

Custard part—1 cup sugar, 1 cup milk, 1 egg (beaten together); 1/2 or 2/3 cake of chocolate; beat all together and let come to a boil. Then mix together the following: 3 eggs beaten separately, 1/2 cup butter creamed with 1 cup sugar; put in the custard and mix well. Sift 2 cups flour three times and put 2 spoonfuls of baking powder, then beat whites of eggs and put in. Do not let cake cook too long.

How to Cook The Thanksgiving Turkey.

Kill and dress the turkey two days before you wish to serve it. The day before Thanksgiving put it on to cook in boiling water, be sure the water is boiling when you put the turkey in. Cook until thoroughly done then remove from the liquid and set away to cool. On Thanksgiving morning heat the liquid and pour it over three pints of stale bread crumbs; add one large onion chopped fine; one tablespoonful ground sage; let stand until soft and crumbly. Stuff the turkey with this mixture and spread it entirely over the body, filling it out plump and round. Place in a hot oven until nicely browned. Baste frequently while baking with melted butter or some of the liquid in which the turkey was boiled.

Mince Meat.

Two pounds of chopped apples; two pounds of lean beef, boiled and minced fine; one pint of beef suet, cooked and chopped; one pint of sugar; one pound of seedless raisins; one pound of currants; one half pound of citron; chop all the fruit well. Add one tablespoonful each of ground cinnamon, cloves, allspice and grated nutmeg; one scant tablespoonful salt and one pint of vinegar. If too dry add a little more vinegar or some kind of fruit juice. Make several days before using. This quantity will make several pies.

Apple Float.

Press one quart of stewed apples through a colander, sweeten to taste and add the well-beaten whites of one or two eggs. When well mixed stir in one cup

of finely chopped dates and one cup of English walnuts, also chopped fine. Serve with whipped cream.

To whip cream take real thick cream that is thoroughly chilled and beat until light and foaming. Sweeten a very little.
