

FEDERAL OFFICERS VISIT STOKES

Still Is Captured Near Walnut Cove—Three Men Arrested.

Federal Prohibition Agents W. T. Elber and R. L. Lovelace paid Stokes a visit last week and demolished a blockade distillery near Walnut Cove. A considerable quantity of beer was also destroyed. The officers did not make any arrests.

The Winston Journal says that these same officers, when they got on the train at Walnut Cove, saw some negroes on the car with suspicious looking baggage and after keeping close watch on them they discovered that the negroes had booze. When the train stopped at Ogburn station, near Winston-Salem, the negroes throw off the suspicious baggage and other negroes took charge of it, whereupon three negroes were arrested and ten gallons of sugar head was seized. The three men were carried to Winston and lodged in the county jail to await a hearing in the case against them.
