Law Requires Autos To Stop At Crossings

Richmond, Va., May 6.—Drivers of automobiles and other vehicles using the public highways of Virginia must come to full stop before crossing any main line railway track under a law recently enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia.

The law provides that drivers of all vehicles on approaching any grade crossing of a main line railway track outside an incorporated town must stop not less than ten feet nor more than 100 feet from the nearest rail. A penalty of ten dollars for each violation is provided in the act.

Advocates of this act pointed out that its enforcement would greatly reduce the number of grade crossing accidents. By enacting this law the Virginia solons have given legal effect to the admonitions which railroads have for many years displayed on their crossing signs, urging drivers of vehicles to "stop, look and listen."

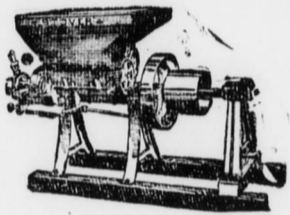
