BILL FOR ROAD BONDS IN VIRGINIA. Was Introduced in the Virginia Legislature Last Week—May Be Left To A Vote Of the People. Richmond, Va., March 8.—A bill providing for a state-wide referendum on a \$50,000,000 bond issue to finance road construction was introduced today in the Virginia state senate by Senator Baker and shortly afterward Senator Vaughan introduced a measure which would authorize the governor to borrow \$5,000,000 to meet the present emergency needs of the state highway department and to impose a tax of one cent a gallon on gasoline to take care of the funding of the notes in case the bond issue proposal is not approved by the electorate. Both measures were drafted at a meeting of legislators last night, and it was declared were "compromise" bills to take the place of the \$122,000,000 bond issue program of the Virginia Good Roads Association and the three-cent gasoline tax plan. Senator Epps, of Nottoway, chief proponent of the three-cent gasoline tax for financing the good roads program and other leading opponents of the bond issue declared, however, that the bills did not have their support. Both bills also were introduced in the House by Delegate Bolman Willis, of Roanoke. The fifty million dollar bond issue measure would provide for holding the referendum in September.
