

**Notice Of Election In Walnut Cove Special School Tax District On Question Of Issuing \$15,000.00 School House Bonds Of Said District.**

Notice is hereby given to all parties whom it may concern, that an election will be held in Walnut Cove Special School tax district, at the clothing store of Joyce Clothing Company, in Walnut Cove, N. C., on—

The 16th day of April, 1923, for the purpose of ascertaining the will of the qualified voters in said district, upon the question of issuing \$15,000.00 School House Bonds of said district, to run twenty years, with semi-annual interest thereon, at 6 per cent, per annum, for the purpose of building, repairing and furnishing said school building, or buildings with suitable equipment. The rate of taxation to be eighteen cents on each hundred dollars valuation of taxable property therein.

That for the purpose of holding said election, J. Carl Joyce has been appointed registrar, and R. L. Murphy and S. C. Rierson judges thereof.

That an entirely new registration of voters for said special election in said district has been ordered.

That at said election, those who are in favor of levying said tax, and issuing said bonds will vote a ballot "For School-house Bonds," and those who oppose the same will vote a ballot, "Against School-house Bonds."

That said election will be held as near as may be under the general law for the election of members of the General Assembly.

That it will be held in pursuance of Article 39, chapter 93 Consolidated Statutes of North Carolina, and the subsequent amendments thereof.

That the registration books for said election shall open on the 16th day of March, 1923, for the registration of voters, and close on the 7th day of April, 1923. That said books shall be kept open all the time, Sundays excepted, from and including March 16th to and including April 7th, 1923, and that Saturday, April the 14th, 1923, shall be challenge day.

That at the close of said election, the said election officers shall tabulate the result thereof and make return thereof under their hands to the Board of Commissioners of Stokes county, as prescribed by law.
