NOTICE OF LETTING OF BRIDGE CONTRACTS IN STOKES COUNTY.

On the first Monday in December, 1923, the Stokes County Highway Commission will receive bids until 12 o'clock noon, for the construction of the following bridges: Bids will be received at their office in Danbury:

Three bridges in Big Creek township: Two small beam bridges on the Collinstown road and one truss bridge with beam approaches at Joyce's mill, over Don river. For these bridges the county will furnish all the steel for the truss, except the four end posts and the four shoes. The county will also provide all steel for the beam spans on the Collinstown road bridges.

For the following bridges the contractor will furnish all material: Beam bridge of three spans over Little Yadkin near King, beam bridge of one span over Little Snow Creek on the Priddy road, beam bridge of two spans over Snow Creek on Priddy road.

Bids must be made on each bridge separately. And bids should be made out for the bridges for wood floors and also for concrete floors. No bridge will be considered that is of less than ten ton capacity, with the stress of the steel at 16,000 pounds.

Certified check of five per cent of bid must accompany the bid. Check should be made in favor of S. P. Christian, Chairman of Highway Commission. Bond will be required of the successful bidder of \$2,000 plus twenty-five per cent of the contract price of the work.

The Highway Commission reserves the right to accept or reject any or all bids.
