Moore's Knob Higher Than Asheville

Moore's Knob, a peak of the Scouratow mountain range in Stokes, is 2,585 feet above sea level, according to the United States Geological Survey. The survey also shows that there is a tablet on the postoffice building at Asheville on which the elevation of that point is given as 2,298.412 feet above sea level, so that a comparison of the figures shows that the Stokes mountain peak is 377 feet higher than the site of the Asheville postoffice.
